Introduction

1. Micturating Cystourethrography is used to study the urinary bladder and the urethra.
2. The procedure will be performed by a radiologist. The procedure will generally be performed in the Radiology Department under fluoroscopic x-ray guidance.

Contraindication

1. This examination is contraindicated if the patient has acute urinary tract infection.
2. For children, please bring diapers and clothes for changing.

Potential Risks and Complications

1. Occasionally, local damage to urethra or bladder during catheterization can result in dysuria, hematuria or urinary retention.
2. Rare complications include catheterization of vagina or ectopic ureteral orifice.
3. Uncommon but serious complications include infection, bladder perforation and allergic reaction due to absorption of contrast medium.
