ST. PAUL'S HOSPITAL 120TH ANNIVERSARY Celebration Ceremony cum

Grand Opening of Main Block

On behalf of St. Paul's Hospital, may I first of all thank you whole-heartedly for gracing us with your presence on this auspicious occasion of our 120th anniversary and grand opening of the new Main Block. Today we gather here in this tranquil oasis, surrounded by nice gardens and in

this tranquil oasis, surrounded by nice gardens and in front of the historic Christ the King Chapel built in magnificent Greco Roman style. Beyond these walls is the hustle and bustle of busy downtown Causeway Bay.

When the Congregation first moved here a century ago, the reverse was true. The old Cotton Factory buildings were the only prominent structures in this neighborhood, considered rather remote from the urban centre. I could only admire the foresight of the Sisters in such bold undertaking, because we now become arguably the most convenient hospital in Hong Kong easily accessible by car, bus, minibus, train and tram. Our history dates back a further 20 years before we moved here, when a hospital emerged in the original site of the Convent in the Wanchai waterfront.

In the spirit of St. Paul, the early Sisters from France overcame enormous difficulties to make presence God's kingdom through caring for the sick and needy in this place. Throughout our long history, there were indeed periods of great hardship, including WWII when this place was bombed, taking the precious lives of Sisters, staff and patients. Notwithstanding, the needs of the community always came first, leading to rapid recovery and a long series of remodeling. A dedicated maternity wing called the Notre Dame Pavilion was erected in 1948 to cope with the post-war baby boom. This in turn gave way to a New Wing in 1976. Then came a shining series of Hong Kong's firsts: the first CT scanner in 1977, Hong Kong's first Extra-corporeal Shock Wave Lithotriptor in 1985, and Hong Kong's first MRI in 1989. SPH was truly at the forefront of medical development. We also made history among private hospitals in starting a Resident Doctor system which helped to ensure prompt response to medical emergencies. Our former Medical Superintendent Prof. Sir Harry Fang was also most instrumental in the establishment of the Hong Kong Private Hospitals Association, which introduced the first ever hospital accreditation scheme in Hong Kong.

Moving into the 21st century, the Congregation made another epic decision to redevelop the hospital all over again to match requirements in the modern era. A brand new Block A came into use in 2009, and the original New Wing was demolished to make way for the current Main Block with a floor area about four times as big as Block A. Meanwhile, hospital management underwent radical transformation with a system of hospital and clinical governance that rivals the best in town. Clinical quality and patient safety are assured through the dedicated work of some 16 clinical advisory committees, clinical audit programs, the clinical indicators program, and external accreditation scheme. A robust Hospital Information System facilitates communication and supports clinical decision making. We also have a long history of pastoral care and community outreach services, and a vibrant hospital volunteers program.

All these would not have been achieved without the guidance and staunch support of the Congregation, the Government, members of the Hospital Governing Committee and all Clinical Advisory Committees, visiting doctors, and the dedicated work of our staff members. We are also indebted to all volunteers, community partners, business partners, patients and their relatives who give us their valuable suggestions. Today marks a new chapter in our long journey, and we shall strive to continuously improve our standards and services to those in need. We pray to God for his continuous blessing.

officials, leaders from public and private hospitals and academic institutions, business partners, as well as project architect, consultants and contractors.














Certificates of Appreciation were presented to representatives from P&T Architects and China State Construction (Holding) Ltd.

ST. PAUL'S HOSPITAL 120TH ANNIVERSARY Celebration Grand Dinner























The St. Paul's Hospital 120th Anniversary Celebration Grand Dinner was held in the evening of 23 April 2018 in the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre, with a total attendance of around 1,100 excluding student performers.

Feature murals including a simulation of the old hospital entrance gate, façade of the Christ the King Chapel, and the fountain with a statue of St. Paul in front of the demolished New Wing, as well as a commemoration backdrop with platform, were constructed in the large reception area for photo taking by guests.


The check-in process was expedited by QR barcode system with SMS reminders of the tables to which guests were assigned.




Thanksgiving Mass
